

Dear Pastors, Supporters, and Praying Friends,


Greetings once again from Kenya. The last two months have been extremely busy for us in the work of the Lord.

Unfortunately, our plans to travel to Butula were once again postponed. Two days before we were to travel to Butula, I received word that fuel was difficult to obtain in western Kenya due to a shortage. As our departure date approached, the fuel shortage reached us in Nairobi. The resulting challenges of uncertain availability of fuel along our route, hours-long lines whenever fuel was available, and limits on fuel purchases at any one time led us to postpone our family trip to a later date. With our youth seminar the following week, there were too many possibilities that would jeopardize that meeting.

The first week of April, we held a youth seminar for the young people of Karen Baptist Church. Each afternoon, three classes were held for the youth. I taught the youth what the Bible teaches about baptism. Much false doctrine is taught in Kenya regarding baptism, and many people are confused as to its purpose in the life of a Christian. In addition to these classes, my wife taught the young ladies and Bro. Billy Coley taught the young men practical lessons from the Scriptures. Two firsttime visitors, John and Joy, attended that week and heard the Gospel several times. In the near future, we want to teach John and Joy the Gospel Seed lessons. Please pray for this opportunity.

In April, Karen Baptist Church held a baptism service. Three young men who accepted Christ when I taught the Gospel Seed lessons at Derrick's home were baptized. Sammy, Mark, and Emmanuel have been faithfully coming to church and have become grounded in what it means to be a Christian. What a blessing it was to see them take the next step in following the Lord! Since then, several others in the church have

expressed their desire to follow the Lord in baptism as well.
